We were created for community and we all need somebody to lean on.

KEY SCRIPTURES

Ecclesiastes 4:8

"There was a man all alone; he had neither son nor brother. There was no end to his toil, vet his eves were not content with his wealth."For whom am I toiling," he asked, "and why am I depriving myself of enjoyment? This too is meaningless a miserable business!"

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10, 12

"Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."

Acts 2:42-47

"Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. DISCUSSION

- 1. Read Ecclesiastes 4:8. Discuss what may have transpired to lead this man to come to his conclusion of discontentment.
- 2. Read Ecclesiastes 4:9-10. 12. Discuss what attitudes, beliefs or practices that exist in our current culture that might discourage community or foster self-sufficiency.
- 3. It was said in Sunday's message that God hates aloneness and that self-sufficiency is masked isolation. Discuss how that plays out in people's life. In your own life?
- 4. What dangers exists when people live in isolation?
- 5. Read Acts 2:42-47. If God's plan is for nobody to be alone, but for everyone to be known, loved, cared for and cherished, how did the early church, that is the ekklesia or gathering of God's people, remedy that, as seen in this passage?
- 6. How have you seen or experienced that being carried out today?
- 7. God's intent is to carry out His plan as people are reconciled to God through Jesus' message of love being lived out authentically in community with one another. What is your role as part of God's church in carrying out that mission?
